PART A : SHORT-ANSWER QUESTIONS (60 MARKS)

INSTRUCTIONS : Answer **ALL SIX (6)** questions.

1. The functions of communication can be understood by studying why communication is essential. Identify **THREE (3)** reasons why communication is essential and explain each of the reasons adequately. Illustrate your answer with one specific example per reason. (3 or 4 marks per reason: 1 for identification, 2 or 3 for explanation, including example.)

- 2. The three types of noise show how noise, as a technical term, contributes to the functions of human communication. Identify the **THREE (3)** types and explain them adequately. Illustrate your explanation with one specific example per type. (3 or 4 marks per type: 1 for identification, 2 or 3 for explanation, including example.)
- 3. Perception plays an important part in the functions of human communication. Our perception is affected by four types of selective activities. Identify the **FOUR (4)** types of selectivity and explain each adequately. Illustrate your explanation of each type with a specific example. (2.5 marks per type: 0.5 for identification, and 2 for explanation, including example.)
- 4. Language has rules. Identify the **THREE (3)** sets of rules in language and explain each adequately. Illustrate your explanation of each set with a specific example. (3 or 4 marks per set of rules: 1 for identification, 2 or 3 for explanation, including example.)
- 5. What does it mean to say language is arbitrary? Explain, using an example to illustrate. Also, explain how language and culture are closely connected. Use the example of gender to illustrate. (5 marks per explanation, including example.)
- 6. Explain nonverbal communication. Why are nonverbal codes difficult to interpret? Explain the **TWO (2)** major reasons given in your textbook. Illustrate each of the reasons with a specific example. (4 marks for definition/explanation and 3 marks per reason including example.)

PART B : SHORT-ESSAY QUESTIONS (40 MARKS)

1. Explain intercultural communication and discuss **THREE (3)** intercultural problems, using specific examples to illustrate. Then, explain **TWO (2)** ways for overcoming the problems. (4 marks for intercultural communication, 3 marks per problem, and 3.5 marks per way to overcoming problems.)

2. Explain the differences among interpersonal communication, mass communication and social media communication in terms of sender, channel, and feedback. Use a specific example for each type of communication to illustrate your explanation. (6 or 7 marks per area of difference.)
