Quiz shows first became 1 in the USA in the late 1950s, with radio and TV shows such as

Audience' and '50:50', where the computer takes away two wrong answers, and leaves the correct
answer and one 13 wrong answer. The big prize money that attracted viewers to the show
was funded by an 14 simple idea: 15contestants paid a small charge to call
telephone hotline to enter their names for the show. These 16so popular that viewers
had to phone dozens of times to stand any chance of appearing. This 17formula proved
so successful that the show has been sold to more than forty countries worldwide. In fact, it is probably
being shown somewhere in the world as you read this! John Carpenter became the first winner
18 on the American show in 1999 but things haven't always gone 19 to plan.
On the Thai version of the show, Lertlak Panchanawapron had exhausted her 20 life lines


